Passionate about Parks and the Outdoors? Consider being a volunteer for the San Antonio Natural Areas.

Though the park has staff to coordinate the educational and park maintenance activities, there is a need for extra hands. Volunteers are always needed to help with guided hikes and educational activities.

Volunteering is known to have many <u>physical and mental health benefits</u>. The value of being outside in nature is well recognized, but helping to maintain it can give an added sense of purpose. When assisting in educational activities, you can have a sense of accomplishment and share your knowledge and skills and even acquire new ones. While the media generally reports on the benefits of volunteering for <u>older people</u>, it has added altruistic benefits for all ages.

You do not have to be able to identify all the plants and animals. You can assist or shadow Master Naturalists who lead school groups. This is a great way to become familiar with the flora and fauna of the San Antonio Natural Areas. The busiest time of year for field trips is the fall and spring weekday mornings. Volunteers may also help with weekend events such as Kids to Parks Day, Second Saturday workshops, outreach in the community with partner organizations, and more.

In addition, volunteers can attend monthly training sessions held in the park's classroom. Training last approximately 90 minutes and cover a specific topic related to ecology such as geology, native plants, animal adaptations, and more.
