San Antonio Parks and Recreation Natural Areas Stewardship Activities September, 2017

During these dog days of summer, it's always a delight to see the persistent plants that find a way to bloom. Among these is the delicate, but definite, milkweed *Cynanchum barbigerum*. Milkweeds often conjure images of plants like antelope horns (*Asclepias asperula*), butterfly weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*), and maybe green milkweed/pearl vine (*Matelea reticulata*). But there is another less showy milkweed, *Cynanchum barbigerum*. A close-up view of the flower (picture courtesy of Tona Cantu) reveals some spectacular details including a star-shaped flower with fuzzy edges. So where did such a delicate little vine get a name like Cynanchum? Look to the <u>Greek</u>: *kynos*, (meaning "like a dog") and *anchein* ("to choke"). When you find this vine in the summertime, you will see the way it drapes itself over shrubs, it might be capable of choking a dog!



To discover and enjoy more little treasures of the Natural Areas while also contributing to their management, feel free to join us on our September work parties.
