## **Introducing New Special Projects Manager for Natural Areas**

Kelsey Scherschel has joined the Parks and Recreation Department as Special Projects Manager for Natural Areas. She will be overseeing the management of the City of San Antonio's Natural Areas, and comes to San Antonio natural areas parks with a strong background in natural resource management. She most recently worked at Government Canyon State Natural Area, on San Antonio's northwest side, and also brings a diversity of experience having worked across the country with several federal agencies. Kelsey is excited about this opportunity to ensure citizens, both local and wide, are able to enjoy the beautiful and unique natural resources found in the San Antonio area

San Antonio is at the confluence of several major ecoregions, including the South Texas Plains, Edwards Plateau, and Blackland Prairie. Because of this, the San Antonio area has a high diversity of wildlife and plant species. Our Natural Areas work to preserve these natural ecosystems and foster appreciation and experiences between people and nature. Some of the tasks staff and volunteers at Natural Areas carry out include endangered species monitoring, habitat restoration, and outdoor education. Natural Areas tend to be less developed than other parks in San Antonio to allow users the opportunity to enjoy the natural setting. Natural Areas in San Antonio include: Crownridge Canyon Natural Area, Eisenhower Park, Friedrich Wilderness Park, Gold Canyon Park, Phil Hardberger Park, Panther Springs Park, Stone Oak Park, Medina River Natural Area, and Walker Ranch Historic Landmark Park.
